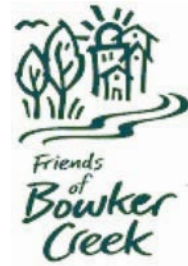
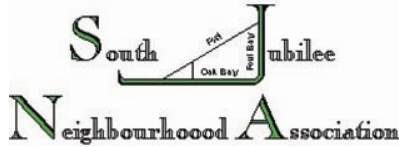

Since March, representatives from your neighbourhood association and the Vancouver Island Health Authority have been meeting to discuss the proposed patient care centre building slated for the Royal Jubilee Hospital site.

Now you have an opportunity to be part of the design process. Come to one of the workshops outlined in the enclosed pamphlet. You will have a chance to find out more about the project. More importantly, you can share your views about the building design, landscaping, traffic management and other issues that concern you. Your ideas will be incorporated into the design guidelines sent to companies bidding on the design and construction of the building. The bidding process is due to start in the first week of July—your input is needed now to be included in the design criteria. We strongly urge you to take this opportunity to contribute!
