Land Development: Vicki

- Storm water management is still a major concern for Saanich residents, in particular those living on the Mt. Tolmie slope. Unfortunately residents are being refused overland water coverage on their policies as a result of repeat claims. The board is considering asking Saanich to conduct a public presentation in the Fall at a local venue on the flooding issue. The CCA will source out contacts within Saanich.
- Update given on the meeting held with Hope Lutheran Church involving the future of the church at their present location. Vicki, Jamie and Meralin attended the meeting with the pastor.
- Discussion on the future of SD land sale at Lansdowne South.

CALC: Meralin

- New student housing building was built to Leeds Gold standard with triple window glazing and sophisticated heat recovery systems. 622 net new beds were created and a new Commons cafeteria. New food services recycling programs have been implemented.
- The Ian Stewart sports complex on Gordon Head Rd. will cease to operate as currently will be developed as new housing centre for staff and professors. This is to address the lack of supply of housing.

SCAN: Jamie

- Key note speaker was Saanich senior planner Alanna McDonagh who discussed Community Amenity Contribution update policy as well as the McKenzie corridor Plan.
- Roundtable discussion around the notion that Saanich CA's do not have a voice that is being recognized. It was agreed that the CA's need to up our communication effectiveness.
